# Written statement of action update

#### 1. Introduction

As SEND Executive Board Members will recall there are 115 actions on the written statement of action. The Board agreed to risk rate the actions as follows:

Red: Not on track


Amber: Not on track but can be recovered

Green: On track / complete

This report highlights those actions rated as 'red' and 'amber'.

## 2. Current risk rating

The October update of the tracker is attached at Appendix 1. In summary it shows that we have completed about 50% of the actions in the written statement of action:



#### 3. Recommendation

The SEND Executive Board are asked whether they are assured that sufficient steps are being taken to implement the 'amber' and 'red' actions.

### 4. Actions assessed as 'red', not on track

There are seven actions currently rated as red listed. The first five relate to children and young people's and parent carer participation, co-production and feedback as follows:

Include Children and Young People (CYP) and parent/carer views in education service reports, which are then amalgamated into an overarching annual education report, including an accompanying CYP version, original timescale: December 2018 (1B vi)

Organise a comprehensive, and ongoing, schedule of engagement with parents/carers, including education, health and care representation, original timescale: September 2018 (4B i)

Implement a termly 'you said, we did' approach to feed back to CYP and parents/carers via the local offer website, original timescale January 2019 (1B vii)

Agree co-production priorities with the Parent Carer Forum (PCF) and establish a forward plan for regular review, original timescale: October 2018 (4B iv)

With the PCF, draft and agree a working accord between the PCF forum and key decision makers in the local area, original timescale: December 2018 (4B v)

We have examples of how we work with children, young people and parents /carers to inform service development. However, we are currently unable to describe a coherent strategic approach. A SEND Community Wellbeing Officer has been appointed to progress this work.

The sixth 'red' action is:

Implement a digital system that allows aggregation of information re: provision identified in Education, Health and Care Plans (EHCPs), original timescale December 2018 (3D i)

This is a more complex process than originally envisaged. It requires developing a common coding system for provision defined in statutory assessments and redesigning our EHC plan and processes. However, we have been made aware that the SEND Code of Practice is to be updated, there may be a significant change to the EHC plan and a national template issued. We have asked our DfE and CQC advisers the best way to take this forward.

The seventh 'red' action is:

Hold education, health and social care training day re: outcomes and specificity in EHCPs, original timescale March 2019, (3D iii)

We have established a draft training programme for an audience estimated at about 600 officers across education, health and social care. We have not had the capacity to deliver this training. The DMO and Senior Send Nurse in the CCG are also involved in the training and commence in post in October and November respectively. We are exploring using an on-line training package developed by Norfolk Council to reduce the staff resources required.

## 5. Actions assessed as 'amber': Not on track but can be recovered

In writing the 'written statement of action' we were required to show the actions underneath each significant weakness area. This has meant some duplication of actions. To help with ease of reading, this document groups the 50 'amber' rated actions together into themes.
